The books in the school have come recommended to the school from a variety of sources, staff read and ensure that it is age appropriate for the population. School needs to be a mirror and a window for students, be reflective of a diverse population and expose students to that diverse population.

Sexual orientation is not addressed at the elementary level, individual students are supported and directed back to parents

Week: - Positive sidewalk chalk messages of uniqueness and inclusion
